Lent in Italy

Italy, with Venice's annual festivities, is much more famous for Carnevale, the day before Lent begins, than it is for the 40-day countdown to Easter. However, among Catholics, who make up the majority of Italy, Lent is the holiest time of year. And there is much work to do in preparation of the anniversary of when Jesus rose from the dead.

Known as Quaresima, or the 40th day, in Italian, Lent is the word Catholics use to describe the fast before Easter. The idea

A Prelude to Lent ... Venice Carnival 2009 The Venice Carnival is the largest and most important Venetian festival, an appreciated cock-

festival, an appreciated cocktail of tradition, entertainment, history and transgression in a unique city, a festival that attracts thousands of people from around the world each year.

The Carnival has very old origins. It is a festival that celebrates the passage from winter into spring, a time when seemingly anything is possible, including the illusion where the most humble of classes become the most powerful by wearing masks on their faces. is to abstain from certain things, especially on Fridays, as penance for our sins, and to reflect on Jesus' resurrection, especially on Sundays during Lent. Forty is a significant number in the Bible - to name a few examples, Moses is on the mountain for 40 days, it rains for 40 days and nights in the story of Noah's Arc, and Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness praying and fasting, according to religion and Bible experts.

Today, many Catholics - including many Italians - still make

The official start of the Venice Carnival dates back to 1296, when the Senate of the Republic made the Carnival official with an edict declaring the day before Lent a public holiday.

After an interruption lasting almost two centuries, the tradition of Carnival was rediscovered by the Municipality in 1980 and since then it has taken place every year with success. The 2009 edition, which will go on from February 13 to 24, will be called "Sensation, 6 senses for 6 districts" and will accompany **OUR CULTURAL PAGE**

sacrifices or changes during Lent in an attempt to be closer to Jesus. The most well-known tradition during Lent is meatless Fridays. On Ash Wednesday and every Friday until Easter arrives, Catholics refrain from eating any sort of meat. Fish, vegetables, and fruits are acceptable. The very old, the very young, and the sick are exempt from this rule and can eat meat if they so choose. Some Italian Catholics refrain from eating meat on Fridays year round. It's a personal choice and is no longer a Church rule.

For Lent ... Linguine alla Ricotta -(Linguine with Ricotta)

- 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter
- 1 large garlic clove, minced
- 3/4 pound ricotta cheese
- 2 tablespoons whipping cream
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh Italian parsley
- 9 ounces linguine
- Parmesan cheese

Melt butter in heavy small saucepan over medium heat. Add garlic and saute two minutes. Combine ricotta, cream, parsley and butter mixture in large bowl. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

Cook linguine in large pot of boiling salted water until just tender but still firm to bite, stirring occasionally. Drain. Toss with ricotta mixture. Serve immediately. with Parmesan cheese. Serves 2
