<u>In Their Own Words</u> **Hello Fellow Members**

I was born in this country and taken to Italy at age three. I grew up under the shadow of the Fascist Party and the Catholic Church (no apologies intended). From these institutions I learned two things.

1) You are an individual and therefore responsible for your actions and consequences (i.e. rewards and/or punishments).

2) As a citizen you should ask what can I do to make things better for society rather than ask what society can do for me?

At age eighteen I returned to the USA courtesy of the USA government. When I arrived in New York I was penniless and \$150 in debt to the government. I was able to pay back the government in 10 months.

I started evening cases as soon as possible to learn English. My accent is still with me, but I can communicate pretty well. I took advantage of everything that this country had to offer. I finished my high school, obtained a degree in mechanical engineering from U.W. and a masters degree in finance from Seattle U (I'm still a professional licensed engineer in Washington) while working full time.

In no other country in the world would this have been possible except the USA. This is not a great country it is a fantastic country.

I was mentored and proposed for membership into the Italian Club by **Luigi Cella** who I consider one of the best presidents of the Italian Club and as a contributor to the com-

OUR ITALIAN HERITAGE

Traveling in Italy... by Tina Conforti, Field Reporter

As summer travel quickly approachs us, those Italian citizens wishing to travel to countries requiring a passport will be faced with new passport requirements.

Italian citizens requesting new passports will have to record their fingerprints when presenting their request at the Italian Consulate General. Requests sent by mail or through the Honorary Counsular office will no longer be accepted. Minors under the age of 12 (who, as of November 25, 2009 are required to posses an individual passport) are exempt from recording their fingerprints.

Please note that the new European Passport with fingerprints will gradually replace those currently in use which will remain valid and fully recognized as travel documents. Therefore, requesting a new European passport will not be necessary if the passport in use is still valid.

Rome and Milan are gearing up to test a body scanner on flights to the United States in the wake of the failed Christmas Day bomb attack of 2009. Installation of the new scanners is expected to begin at Fiumicino airport first. Italy is among the first European countries to try out the new scanners using X-ray vision.


No Miss Italian Club Seafair this Year
