## **CHANGE & INNOVATION ABOUND 2011 ITALIAN FESTIVAL**

For those not paying attention to detail, this year's Italian Festival probably looked a great deal like the 23 that preceded it. While the physical footprint of the event hasn't changed much for the last ten years, there really were a number of new activities and features. Probably the most dramatic was the relocation of the Historical Photo

Exhibit to a tent just outside the Fisher Pavilion. Although this was duet o the remodeling of the Center House and therefore temporary, there is no question that more people visited the exhibit this year than ever before. Now that they are aware of how special it is, perhaps from now on, they will seek it out if it moves to the Center House. For the same reason, there was no KING-FM Stage in the Center House this year and consequently, no previews from Seattle Opera. We did manage to schedule the Ballard Sedentary Sousa Band on the Moretti Main stage and they were a big hit! Look for them to return next year on one stage or another. Gerardo DiPietro, an ASL storyteller, gave a pair of wonderful performances acting out the story of Pinocchio. Adults and kids of all ages were fascinated by his ability to communicate by body language alone. Home Depot was also new to Tino's Cortile, the kids courtyard. There children could

paint actual tiles to take home. Right next door was another new booth doing colored hair, feathered hair extensions and sparkly tattoos.

Our Celebrity Chef was Rossella Rago of WebTV's "Cooking with Nonna." She fascinated the audience with a cooking demonstration by an Italian grandmother who didn't speak any English. Rossella lives in New Jersey but grew up in Bari and was able to be witty and charming in both languages. Finally, our headliner on the Moretti Mainstage appeared on Sunday afternoon instead of Saturday evening as usual. They were still able to hold the crowd and if you missed them, you really missed something.

The band was Enrico Capuano & Tammuriata rock from Rome and as the name implies, they play tarantellas and other old

Italian rhythms with a definite rock 'n roll sensibility - fun to listen and dance to and very exciting to watch.

The 25th Annual Italian Festival is only 11 months away on September 28, 28 & 30, 2012. It will coincide with the 50-year celebration of Seattle Center and the 1962 World's Fair.

## Governor Albert Dean Rosellini Biography

Al Rosellini was born in Tacoma, Washington, the on- made and measured . . . Budget reform, economic ly son of Italian immigrants. He worked his way through college and law school at the University of Washington. At the age of 29, he was elected to the Washington State Senate as its youngest member, representing the 33rd district in south Seattle, the home of many Italian immigrants. A New Deal Democrat, Rosellini served from 1939 to 1957, eventually rising to the rank of majority leader. He was elected governor in 1956.

As governor, Rosellini coupled personal charm with decades of political know-how, developing a reputation for decisiveness and ability to move ahead on long-stalled projects. Don Hannula, longtime political columnist for The Seattle Times, wrote in 1996, "He was not a man of empty rhetoric. He got things done. His legacy is everywhere. In order to promote economic development, Rosellini established a state department of commerce and championed the Seattle World's Fair in 1962. He shepherded construction of the longest floating bridge in the world, the Evergreen Point Floating Bridge, which was opened in 1963, and carries State Route 520 over Lake Washington from Seattle to Medina. The bridge is named after him. In addition, he was a tireless supporter of higher education, strengthening the state university system and developing a system of junior colleges. During his time in office, Rosellini also reformed the state budget process and balanced the budget. Rosellini was defeated in his bid for a third term as governor by Republican Daniel J. Evans in 1964. Rosellini made a comeback bid in 1972, but while he captured the Democratic nomination, he was again defeated by Evans.

In his 1997 biography, Rosellini, Immigrant's Son and Progressive Governor, author Payton Smith wrote: "He was attracted to issues where progress could be

development, transportation, higher education and institutions were the core matters to which he devoted his talent and governmental know-how."

In order to support projects, he raised the state sales tax from 3.5 cents to 4 cents, prompting Republicans to dub him "Taxellini."

After leaving office in 1965, Rosellini returned to the practice of law, and also became a political consultant, specializing in matters of the liquor and entertainment industries. Over the years, Rossellini served as an elder statesman of the state Democratic Party, mentoring political figures such as current Washington governor Christine Gregoire and former governor Gary Locke. In 2003.

Until his death, "The Gov." still attended fundraisers for candidates and helped raise money for charities, particularly the Washington State Olympics Committee, which he chaired for many years. As the Pacific Northwest has flourished, many local academics, media columnists, and political veterans have concluded that Rosellini was the state's best governor of modern times. Danny Westneat,
