To the point...Your shoes are not the best weapons.

There are words and concepts from history that eventually get alternate uses. One such is the stiletto.

Certainly, the term now conjures up high fashion shoe heels (Alta moda). In researching this story I found Crocks with stiletto heels and if you have great balance, 7-inch high heel stiletto ballet ankle boots. Let's not forget pointy folding pocket knives.

The Italian word "stiletto" comes from the Latin word stylus, the thin pointed Roman writing instrument used to engrave wax or clay tablets in ancient times

But in the Middle Ages, as in all times, the world of war evolves. It is similar to rock, scissors, and paper. Except in war, what kills you only makes your opponent tougher.

Armor was the solution to everything. Lined with chain mail, it was tough and even stylishly intimidating. Armor protected the wearer from sticks and stones and certainly from other items used to "level the playing field" of battle.

But armor has to let in air and move via joints. And so, the idea of using a long pointed blade was born. Thrust through openings in armor and through eye slits in helmets, and more specifically through chain mail, the stiletto was the simple solution to armor technology.

The stiletto seen in this story is Venetian in design. Take note of the stylized design elements. It is about 15 inches (35.5 centimeters) in total length.

When metal is formed to be so thin, however it becomes brittle. So metalsmiths made the base of the blade triangular for strength. There was a lot of experimenting with blade lengths. Some were made very short so users, in particular women, could hide the stiletto – about the size of a modern seam ripper or writing pen – easily for self-protection.

The modern up-and-coming person of say 1490 would not be caught dead without their stiletto. This was frustrating to civil authorities trying to improve their respective images of public safety. But trying to control personal protections is similar to "stop signs being considered just a suggestion." Citizens see it as their personal responsibility to interpret this regulation.

Longer versions of the stiletto were created for different applications. One became the epee dueling weapon used for training and competition, paired (not parried) alongside foils or sabers.

But the most used versions were as an offensive weapon and even more so, a concealed weapon by assassins.

Stiletos are for thrusting with a needle-sharp point, often made with no sharp cutting edges. A strike can be made quickly and deeply, producing little blood then quickly concealed; not so messy as other forms of murder.

2022-2023 Scholarship – Application Form

The Italian Club of Seattle is awarding one, One-Thousand-dollar (\$1,000.00) scholarship. The scholarship for the 2022-2023 school year will be awarded to the student who is selected based on meeting or exceeding the scholarship criteria (noted below). As in years' past, the better the GPA, the better chance of scholarship award.

Next steps in the scholarship process:

- April 01, 2022 – Application Submittal Window Opens
- May 31, 2022 – Application submission window closes, application verification
- June 2022 – Award Recipient determined in the June board meeting
- September 2022 – Recipient published in the *il Ficcanso* and presented at the General Meeting
- October 2022 – Scholarship payment made to the school on behalf of the recipient

The qualifications each recipient needs to meet or exceed are:

1. A parent or grandparent of the applicant (student) must be in good standing in the Italian Club of Seattle for at least three years.
2. The applicant (student) is enrolled in high school grade 12, or subsequent year at a state accredited, Trade School, College, and/or University, for the 2021-2022 school year.
3. The applicant (student) must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher (with official transcript).
4. Each applicant must write a letter talking about themselves and extra-curricular activities in which he/she is participating.
5. The scholarship is applicable to state accredited Trade School, College, and/or University.
6. The student must be enrolled in and in pursuit of a certificate, license, and/or degree.
7. The application and transcript must be post marked no earlier than April 15th 2022 and no later than May 31st 2022.
8. Applications that are incomplete or missing a transcript will not be considered.


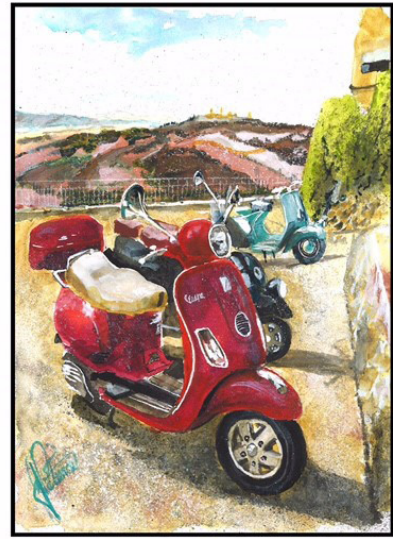
